

DUTY OF THE HOUR.

Epitome of Mr Asquith's Speech.

Right Hon. H. H. Asquith, addressing the Tyneside Liberal Association at Newcastle, said: Nothing is more unjust than to seek to undermine the confidence of the country and the army in a gallant general on the strength of a single error of judgment, or a single reverse. Nor is it a time when it becomes responsible persons to go about whistling for alliance or dazing the world with exhibitions of freaks of new diplomacy. The situation confronting us, after reading today's painful news, is so serious that it is hardly possible to speak of any other topic. We cannot afford to spend time in unavailing regrets. Stesner and more urgent duties are laid upon us. We must not exaggerate the reverse and disasters of to-day. They may become victories of to-morrow. At the same time let us not underestimate the gravity of the task before us. The war has developed proportions which may make it the turning point in the fortunes of the Empire. It has become wider and deeper than the question of maintaining our position in South Africa. It is our title to be known as a world power that is now upon trial, and if we fail here, the Empire ceases.

"Whether the magnitude of the task we have undertaken ought not to have been seen sooner is a question which will have to be answered hereafter, but now it is clear that our force is inadequate. It is the universal opinion of all parties that whatever accession is needed to give the army irresistible superiority, however great the sacrifices involved, the country will readily sanction. The nation confidently expects the Government to do what is necessary. It is our duty as a nation to be united and calm and to concentrate all our resources, material and moral, upon a task which we cannot lay down or leave incomplete, without dealing a blow alike at the honor and safety of our Empire.

AMMUNITION FOR BRITAIN.

U. S. Government Refuses to Prevent its Being Shipped.

When the Union Metallic Cartridge Company, of Bridgeport, Conn., shipped 5,000,000 rounds of ammunition to England on Tuesday last, Dr. Hendrick Muller, envoy extraordinary of the Orange Free State, filed through Consul-General Charles D. Pierce, a protest with Secretary of State Hay. Other orders of Britain for ammunition are being filled by the Bridgeport Company, and Dr. Muller made the protest with the hope of preventing the shipment of these. Consul General Pierce has received a reply from Hay. He refuses to interfere, stating that in case of war belligerents have the right to purchase any kind of goods in neutral countries subject to confiscation after shipment. As the Boers have no seaport, the advantage lies entirely with England. When Mr. Pierce was seen at the Consulate, he said that no comment should be made to Secretary Hay's letter, as it answered all protests completely.

of India, and Sir Frederick Sleight Roberts, Baron of Kandahar and Waterford, K. P., G. C. B., G. C. S. I., G. C. L. E., V. C., D. C. L., LL. D. as he is officially known, was born at Cawnpore, India, in 1832, of Irish parentage. His father, General Sir. Abraham Roberts, G. C. B., was a soldier before him. Lord Roberts began his career in the British Army forty-eight years ago as a 2nd lieutenant in the Bengal Artillery; promotion came gradually, but unceasingly, until he reached the rank of major-general in 1878. In 1883 he became lieutenant-general, in 1890 general, in 1895 field marshal and commander of Her Majesty's forces in Ireland.

He served throughout the siege and capture of Delhi, and was wounded in that campaign, and also took part in a half score of other engagements during the Indian mutiny. He was present throughout the operations connected with the relief of Lucknow, and was at the battle of Cawnpore. In 1867-68 he took part in the Abyssinian expedition, and three years later commanded the Kuram field force in North-western India. In 1879 he commanded the Kabul field force in the Afghanistan expedition, and captured the city of Kabul. He was specially detailed to proceed to the relief of Kandahar and the Southern Afghanistan field force in 1880, and was victorious. He commanded the army of Burmah in 1886 and from 1885 to 1893 was commander in chief for all India.

His decorations include the mutiny medal, with clasps for Delhi, relief and siege of Lucknow, Indian frontier medal, with clasps for Umbeyla, Lushai, and Burmah, Abyssinian medal, Afghan medal, with five special clasps, the Kabul-Kandahar bronze star. He has been the subject of resolutions of thanks on two occasions in both Houses of Parliament.
