A youngster that most of the experts passed by as last fall's auction because he did not appear sound enough to stand the vigorous training necessary for the juvenile futurities, now has the experts raving about him. At the Harrisburg sale last November, Thorpe Hanover, a yearling colt by Tar Heel, 1:57, dam The Old Maid, by Luy Abbe, was knocked down to Del Miller for \$5,000. He was expected to go to two or three times that high. Miller had great faith in him, although he knew that his legs were not just perfect. This year, right from the start, he has been in the headlines and has now had winning miles, over a mile track, in 2:00 3-5, and 2:04 1-5 over a half-mile track. Just recently at a Grand Circuit meeting at Indianapolis, Indiana, he won the Fox Stake for two-year-old pacers in the 2:04 1-5, and was second in the following heat to the California star, Raider Frost, in the season's record mile of 2:00 2-5. In the raceoff between these two, Thorpe Hanover won in 2:05 2-5. The total time of the three miles was the fastest ever turned in by two-year-old colts - 6:07 3-5, which bettered the former mark of 6:08 1-5 set at Lexington, Kentucky, in 1953. It was Miller's fourth victory in the stake; his previous wins were with Black Hawk in 1950, Solicitor in 1950, Captain Adios in 1954, and he ties with Tommy Berry, who also won four times.

SUCCESSFUL TRAINER

Ralph Baldwin, who is a native of Saskatchewan and did his early driving there then later crossed the border and got quite a reputation as a reinsman, and a few years ago took over the training of colts and

aged horses at Two Gats Farm, Carmel, Indiana, is having tremendous success this year with Hoot Song, that two weeks ago was beaten in a thrilling battle by Hickory Smoke in the \$111,000 Hambletonian stake. 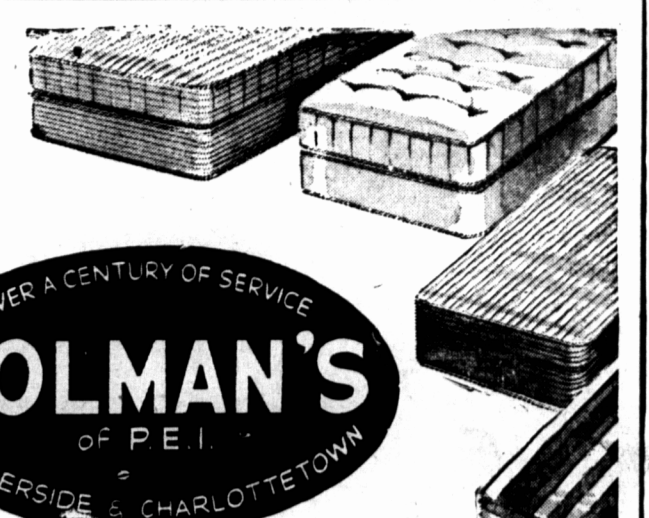

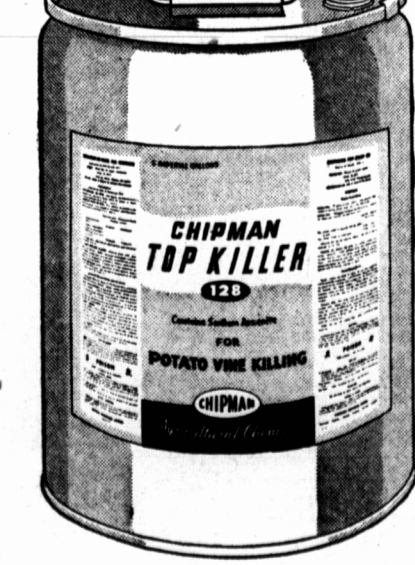
