Island Girls Is President Of National Pen-Pal Assoc.

While most people feel that writing even one letter a month is a burden, 16-year-old Lyda Hunter of Kensington finds herself at her typewriter every spare moment, turning out correspondence to all points on the globe, and she enjoys every minute of it.

Lyda heads the Canadian branch of the Ambassadors of Friendship, an international pen pal association.

Although she attends grade 10 at Kensington Regional High School and has no less than 100 other students here, Lyda still manages to process upwards of 11 letters per day, finding pen pals for the hundreds of teenagers who contact her, and writing letters to nine pen pals of her own.

Lyda began her hobby in June of 1961 after writing the headquarters of the Ambassadors of Friendship in Miami and she became the chief of the Canadian section. The purpose of the organization is to help pen pals anywhere in the world for people between the ages of 12 and 21.

The main source of publicity and promotion for Lyda has been through a national Canadian magazine which she contacted shortly after taking on her duties. The magazine has a regular pen pal section and was receiving many letters that could possibly be turned over; by tip on heated plate or oven.

LONDON (AP) — The latest British fashion line, unveiled before 500 buyers from the United States in London Monday, takes inspiration from the Gibson Girl drawn by American artist Charles Dana Gibson in the early 1900s.

Buyers from as far as Japan, South America, Canada, the United States and Europe have gathered for the 15th annual fashion week previewing ready-to-wear clothes for next fall and winter.

The 28 London fashion houses mounting the show hope to sell more than £2,000,000 worth of fashionware in the next five days.

The new Gibson Girl look is personalized in black and gray striped, white and black dresses with pin-tucked, button plackets. Frills at the neck, elbow-length sleeves and collars. The Jones vevel hair bow complements the picture.

For leisure in the day, striped fannel is teamed with black brocade angora.

Level is a popular material for coats, suits and dresses in flowing, loose colors.

RUDE EVENING WEAR

Leather and suede has been given new elegance and lifted out of the sportswear range into evening wear. Germanium call suede is tailored in a wrap-over coat dress and hat. Suede is teamed with midnight blue suede in an offset suit.

MEASUREMENTS LEVEL

MARGARET CHASE SMITH'S FAVORITE BLUEBERRY MUFFINS

2 c. sifted flour
4 tsp. baking powder
1/4 tsp. salt
1/4 c. sugar
1/4 c. butter or margarine
1 large egg, well-beaten
1 c. w. blueberries, washed and drained
Sift together dry ingredients. Chop in butter with pastry blender.
Combine egg and milk; add to dry ingredients. Mix only until dry ingredients are dampened. Lightly fold in blueberries.
Fill small, oiled muffin cup 2/3 full. Bake 20 min. in moderately hot oven 400 F. or until done. Makes 12 to 15 muffins.

NOTE: If canned blueberries are used, drain and blot on paper towels. Proceed as with fresh berries.

OMELETTES' OMELET FOR 4

4 large eggs
1 tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. pepper
4 tsp. hot water
2 tsp. butter

Break eggs into bowl. Add salt and pepper; beat until thick and light.

Stir in hot water. Meantime, beat 2 fry an omelet pan and melt butter. Pour in omelet mixture; raise cooked portion with fork at edges so uncooked egg will flow out and be cooked.

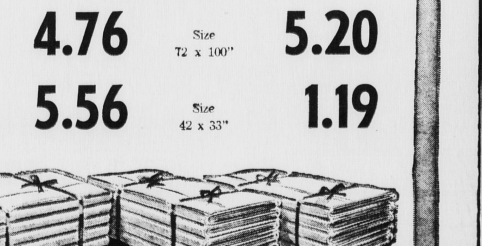
