

# Cardinals Bench Sam Etcheverry

ST. LOUIS (AP)—St. Louis football Cardinals, after losing three straight games, will bench veteran quarterback Sam Etcheverry in favor of second-year man Charlie Johnson for Sunday's game against the Eastern Conference-leading Washington Redskins in St. Louis.

We feel Johnson earned a chance to start after his performance last Sunday," head coach Wally Lemm said of the National League's Cardinals. "He throws a bit quicker than Etcheverry and he's an intelligent boy with good potential."

I hate throwing him there so soon, but we have to do something," Johnson, a collegiate star for

New Mexico State, replaced Etcheverry in the final quarter of last Sunday's 31-14 loss to New York Giants. The 23-year-old Johnson, who threw only 13 passes as a Cardinals rookie last year, completed seven of 14 passes for 57 yards Sunday.

Etcheverry, who led Montreal Alouettes at quarterback for nine years, had his troubles since coming to the Cardinals last season. He has been benched regularly by St. Louis fans. The Jets continued Sunday when he completed only four of 10 passes for 50 yards and was thrown for numerous losses while attempting passes.

Lemm absolved Etcheverry of much of the blame for the Cardinals'.

CALGARY (CP)—The Herald says in a story from Edmonton that Edmonton Eskimos at the Western Football Conference have decided to trade all-star quarterback Jackie Parker to the highest bidder during the off-season.

The newspaper says it learned from a reliable source that the Eskimos are not interested in imports. They want good Canadian players and cash. The Herald's source said Parker, 20, has been with the Eskimos nine seasons. He suffered a fractured collarbone this season and returned to action last weekend after a 30-day layoff.

In Edmonton, club manager Joe Ryan was not available for comment on the latest report of a Parker trade. Trade reports of several months ago brought this reply from Ryan: "We'll take \$100,000 and 24 top ball players for him."

# Mackell Sold To L.A. Blades

QUEBEC (CP)—Forward Fleming Mackell has been sold by Quebec Area of the American Hockey League to Los Angeles Blades of the Western Hockey League of the Western League. It was announced Tuesday.

Mackell has been practicing with the Blades for about two weeks and asked to be traded to Los Angeles, where he has set up a business, a spokesman for the Aces said.

He came to Quebec in the 1961-62 season as player-coach after a career in the National League. In the last half of the season he resigned as coach but stayed on as a player.

Citizens in the Transconcrete to date are Belgium's Ravoli, France's Don, Italy's Mantovani, and the Canadian star, The Silk, winner of the Roosevelt International.

Oreal is owned by Mrs. L. M. Bradley of Christchurch, N.Z., and now is being driven by the Canadian reinsman, Ed Arthur.

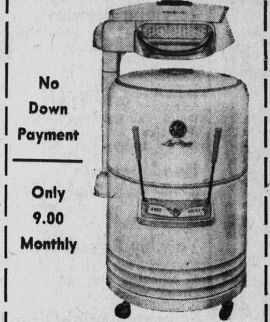

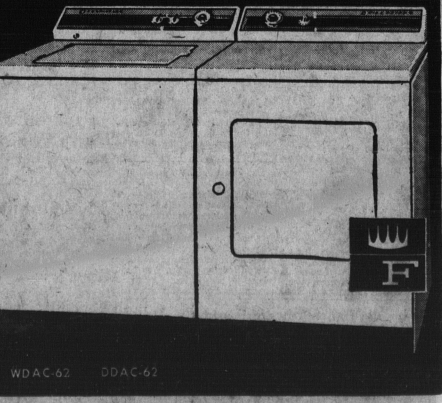
