

**Mariner 4
Pictures Get
Early Release**

WASHINGTON (AP) — The U.S. National Aeronautics and Space Administration said Monday that Mariner 4 pictures of Mars will be released as they are processed.

This is a change from an earlier decision that most of the pictures would be withheld from the public until after scientists had analyzed and discussed them.

NASA said officials of the Jet Propulsion Laboratory at Pasadena, Calif., plan to release the first of the expected 20 photographs as soon as they have gone through the complex processing system.

The agency said this could be within 26 to 48 hours after Mariner begins taking the pictures at about 9 p.m. ADT July 14.

Mariner 4 is to pass within 5,600 miles of Mars July 14, taking the 20 photographs in 24 minutes and recording them on magnetic tape.

It will then be 134,000 miles from the earth. Mariner thereafter will pass behind Mars and be out of touch with the earth until it emerges from the Martian shadow a short time later. Then the spacecraft will start scanning the picture tape, converting the pictures into digital data—a series of zeroes and ones—and sending the information earthward by means of its 10-watt radio transmitter.

**Mt. Pleasant
Mines Ltd. Has
Annual Meeting**

OTTAWA (CP) — John Evans Riddell of St. Andrews, N. B., was elected chairman of Mount Pleasant Mines Ltd., at their annual meeting here Monday. He succeeds Edwin Henry Marley of London, Eng.

William Lee Young of Ottawa, has replaced Mr. Riddell as president of the company. Also elected to the board of directors were Charles John Sullivan, president of Keneco Explorations Canada Ltd., and Kenneth Creery, former chairman of British Metals Corp. of Canada.

Mr. Riddell said that Canadian Betchel Limited, general consultants, will carry out a pre-production program of the New Brunswick-based mine some 40 miles west of Saint John.

The program includes geology and mine development, metallurgical test work and design and construction of a pilot mill.

An interim report to shareholders indicates that there are 4,581,800 tons of ore grading .56 per cent tin, 2.47 per cent zinc, 24 per cent lead and copper.

**LaMarsh Begins
Campaign Moves**

VANCOUVER (CP) — Health Minister Judy LaMarsh arrived here Sunday prepared to do some casting-for salmon and for votes.

"If they can say John Diefenbaker has unofficially started his election campaign, they can say the same about Judy LaMarsh," she said in an interview.

On her program are speeches here and in Victoria today then a tour of Vancouver Wednesday and possibly some fishing before she leaves for her home riding of Niagara Falls.

"I've got to catch my breath in time for the dominion-provincial conference on July 19"

where, she said, she may have something to say about British Columbia's application for a chartered bank that is currently stalled in parliamentary procedure.

Miss LaMarsh said she wanted to reserve her remarks for the conference but said the constitution makes it clear banking is under federal jurisdiction.

"And I don't see how such a bank would particularly benefit the people of B.C."

**Ground Broken
For Pavilion**

MONTREAL (CP) — The five Scandinavian nations, building a joint pavilion at Expo 67, began Monday the first foreign countries to take part in ground breaking ceremonies at the fair site.

The consuls-general of Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden participated with Mayor Jean Drapeau of Montreal and Robert F. Shaw, deputy commissioner-general of the 1967 world's fair. All wore symbolic Viking horned helmets.

Much of the joint pavilion is to be prefabricated in the Scandinavian countries and assembled at the fair site, on islands in the St. Lawrence River between Montreal Island and the river's south shore. The structure will be 165 feet square and 83 feet high.
