IN MEMORIAM

WALLACE REEVES The death occurred on Thursday evening, April 5th, of Wallace Reeves in his 57th year. Although the deceased had been in failing health for some time, after receiving treatment for one month in the St. Edward's Hospital, his condition seemed greatly improved and he returned home. But on the evening of the above mentioned date he suffered a heart attack and before medical help could reach him, he passed away. His sudden death came as a great shock to his family and to the community at large.

The late Mr. Reeves was born at South Weston on August 19, 1899, the son of Hubert Reeves and Margaret Ann Buchanan and except for two years in Western Canada, his entire life was spent on the old homestead. He was greatly interested in all matters concerning the school and community and any project undertaken for advancement in these fields received his wholehearted support. A faithful member of the Home and School Association, he had also been a member of the school board for 21 years.

Of a kind and genial disposition, he was always ready to help anyone in need, and his death will mean a great loss to the community. But it is in the home that he will be greatly missed, for he was around which his whole life centered.

He leaves to mourn his sorrowful widow, the former Irene Stewart, one daughter, (Mildred) Mrs. Wellington Emman, and three sons, Stewart, Wesley and James at home, one granddaughter, Barbara Jean Emman, also two brothers, Wesley, in Imperial, Sask., Alex in Ontario, and one sister, Irene, Mrs. Eustace Reeves, Long River.

His funeral was held from his late residence on Monday afternoon, April 9th. The service was conducted by Rev. J.K. Campbell, who brought words of comfort from Revelation Chapter 21 verse 1-7 Gospel St. Mark, Chapter 4, verse 29. The Hymns sung were the 23rd Psalm and lead kindly Light. Mr. J.B. Lewis feelingly rendered a eulogy "Sunrise".

The pall bearers were Eustace Paynter, Elmer Reeves, Cecil Reeves, Hugh Buchanan, Emery Mulligan and Eldon Drummond. Interment was in the People's Cemetery, Freetown.
