Purchased Herd Of PEI Holsteins

Mr. Oberg operates a large farm and had the misfortune of losing his entire herd and building by fire last May. Mr. Oberg has completed the purchase of seventeen head of mostly two year old heifers which will be shipped in the near future. It is hoped that this shipment will turn out satisfactorily so as to warrant his return for further replacements at an early date.

CBC Shows Rise In Cost Through Every Department
OTTAWA (CP)—The CBC has reported a net operating deficit of \$1,358,621 in 1955-56 on an income of \$38,942,402—75 per cent of which came from the federal treasury.
The deficit, after depreciation, was caused mainly by a big upsurge in television program costs in the year ended last March 31. It compared with a surplus of \$4,267,668 in 1954-55 when about 80 per cent of the publicly-owned corporation's revenue was in government grants and earmarked taxes.
Cost of all television and radio operations, showing a continuing rise in every department, amounted to \$38,572,512, the previous year, \$29,103,587 in the previous year. Costs of the radio services increased by about \$10,000 to \$13,298,252, but those for TV services jumped by more than \$9,350,000 to \$25,274,260.
Programming as usual was the biggest single item of expense totalling \$24,647,444, of which \$14,748,626 was for television and \$10,472,818 for radio. The previous year's programs cost \$20,916,850 for TV and \$8,822,016 for radio, for a total of \$17,838,866.
The corporation's income of \$38,942,402 was up from \$34,735,788 in 1954-55, due mainly to a gain of almost \$2,875,000 in commercial advertising and a rise of \$1,330,000 in revenue from the special 15-per-cent excise tax on television and radio sets and parts.
Television service income was \$25,362,088, a gain from \$21,275,805, but the big increase in costs left a net deficit of \$1,071,791. Radio brought in a net revenue of \$13,330,000 in revenue from the special 15-per-cent excise tax, slightly higher than the previous year's \$12,886,830 after depreciation.
In 1954-55, the CBC showed a net surplus of \$880,483 on television operations and \$484,050 on radio.
TABLED IN COMMONS
The deficit is met out of an accumulated surplus which now stands at \$9,348,188. The report was tabled today in the Commons by Revenue Minister McCann.
In its supplementary estimates for 1956-57, the government had proposed a grant of \$12,000,000 to meet the anticipated deficit arising from this year's operation of the CBC-TV service.
The report said that extension of the television service, coupled with program developments, put an increasingly heavy load on the CBC's finances. Seven new private stations began operations in the last fiscal year, bringing Canada's total TV outlets to 33—six CBC and 22 privately-owned English stations and two CBC and three private French outlets.
The CBC's national television service averaged 35 hours a week in English and 27 hours in French. The corporation reported total commercial revenue of \$9,134,945, up from \$6,263,190. The figure was arrived at after deductions of \$2,706,455 paid to private stations carrying CBC-produced sponsored programs, \$3,261,870 for agency and network commissions and \$4,368,260 for direct production costs. This meant that gross billings to sponsors and agencies totalled \$19,471,530.
Commercial revenue on TV operations was \$7,403,438, up from \$4,157,325; on radio operations \$1,731,507, down from \$2,105,865. Total CBC income from the federal treasury was \$29,049,955, a rise from \$27,719,947. It included a statutory grant of \$6,250,000 for radio operations and \$22,799,955 from the excise tax which is collected by the revenue department and remitted to the CBC.
