

Sydney Millionaires Defeat Islanders 6-3

SYDNEY, N.S., March 19—(CP)—Sydney Millionaires barged back to within a point of fourth place again tonight by trimming listless Charlottetown Islanders 6-3 before 2,302 fans, the biggest house here in months, in a Maritime Major Hockey League game.

Islanders, dressing only 12 men against a full Millionaire complement of 15, move against Glace Bay Miners tomorrow holding the Sydney club's fate in their hands.

The second-place Charlottetowners wasted little stamina in this one with a half-speed effort and notions that soured the attendance into long spasms of silence and often into boos.

Burly Phil Vitale, Charlottetown defenceman who was penalized for roughing with Sydney's Dunc McIntyre in the last minute of the first period, provoked more ill-will by shouting loudly in the sin-bin vicinity.

Millionaires settled the trend in the first period with three unanswered goals. Ron Rohmer picked through the Island defence for two close-in tallies. MacIntyre added a third at 18:47 on a ripping shot from the left side.

Islanders broke a four-period shutout string by Sydney goalkeeper Cliff Hicks at 9:45 of the second period when Willie Marshall, unprotected at the crease, jammed Johnny Dutchak's shot through the defence.

MacIntyre picked up the Millionaire trend 38 seconds later, wheeling a shot past Ray Frederick shortly after face-off in the Charlottetown end.

Frank Grabowski, Sydney's de-

fence addition on three game try-out basis from Truro, Bearcat, started from his own back-boards on an end to end weave that brought Sydney's fifth goal at 13:24.

Cliff Roach deflected Don McRae's forward extension at 5:28 of the third frame to make it 6-1. Islanders bunched back two scores when Bruno Favero jabbed three times before beating Hicks at 6:07. Five minutes later Bob Gray loosed a 30 foot bullet from the right boards.

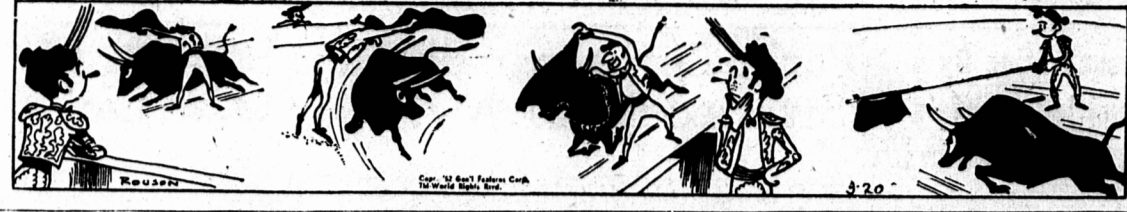
