

U.S. To Take Greater Targets As V-Bombers Withdraw

OTTAWA (AP)—The United States has designated its major strategic targets left uncovered by any withdrawal of British V-bombers from Europe.

This evidently new American commitment to U.S. Gen. Lyman Lemnitzer, Supreme Allied Commander in Europe, was reported during the weekend by

a high source in the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

The source, who attended the session of the NATO council of ministers here last week, said that the United States immediately to confirm the information. But one competent official said:

"It makes sense."

Lemnitzer and his staff at Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers in Europe, are currently negotiating with the British government terms under which the RAF's 80 V-bombers are to be deployed within the new inter-allied nuclear force.

The delicate and complex problems involved were discussed at some length by Lemnitzer and British Defence Minister Peter Thorneycroft in Ottawa last week. Lemnitzer already has made firm arrangements with the U.S. government concerning deployment of the three American Polaris missile submarines assigned to his command.

NATO chiefs report privately that negotiations with the British thus far have proceeded smoothly. Final agreement is expected in early July.

Clearly, however, some difficult problems face the experts. Britain's decision to offer bombers to Lemnitzer's command was qualified by the reservation that they could be withdrawn if some grave national emergency arises.

Somehow, this qualification has to be reconciled with the necessity that Lemnitzer command to ensure that his plans for the defence of Europe are not jeopardized by an sudden British pull-out.

Nova Scotia Chicken Output Takes Leap In Seven Years

PORT WILLIAMS, N.S. (CP)—Nova Scotia now produces 70,000 chickens a week for consumption in the Maritime provinces where up until seven years ago practically all fowl, especially broilers, had to be imported from Quebec and Ontario.

Most of the increase can be attributed to efforts of Canada Poultry Limited which last year paid farmers about \$2,000,000 for poultry.

The company, formed in 1956, is managed by D. L. Fields whose headquarters is in its farming community.

The company was growing to work with farmers in former

broilers—small, young chickens suitable for broiling.

He was appointed manager in 1953 when the company took over Archibald Farm Products processing plant here.

The company began with what Mr. Fields described as a "modest" program of 5,000 broilers a week. He said it was found that he could raise broilers as well or better than anyone else in North America, and people in the Maritimes really took to it.

An example of the increase in local consumption of chicken and broilers, one Halifax restaurant reported that in its five years its weekly sale of chicken rose to 10,000 pounds weekly from 1,200.

THREE UNDERSTANDINGS

Consequently, several carefully worked out understandings are emerging from the S.H.A.P.E. negotiations between the British and Mrs. P. Wiseman.

1. The British are giving Lemnitzer's NATO command a run-down of what military men call the "force generation" rate of the bomber command. This gives an idea of the time needed for the H-bombers to become airborne and dispersed at a time of rising international tension. These arrangements have to be dovetailed with the NATO command's own dispersal and deployment plans.

2. The British and the NATO command also are co-ordinating their so-called "contingency planning" to meet any sudden crisis inside and outside the NATO area. Thus, if the British protected oilfields of the Middle East should be threatened, it probably will involve withdrawal of some—say one-third—of the bombers assigned to Lemnitzer. His command wants as much notice as possible of any such development. This would enable
