

Records Fail Like Flies During Henley Regatta

HENLEY England (CP)—The Henley Regatta, which opened on Saturday, saw records fail like flies during the first day of racing. The 25-year-old American champion, came from behind to defeat husky Hugh Wardell-Yerburgh of Britain by three-quarters of a length in the record time of 7:42. This was four seconds faster than the mark Spero set in a heat.

Margaret Smith Regains Crown

WIMBLEDON (AP)—The Australian tennis juggernaut rolled implacably over Wimbledon's lush green courts Saturday, with four out of five titles in the all-England lawn tennis championships going to Australia. Margaret Smith, 23, regained her women's singles title with a 6-4, 7-5 victory over Maria Bueno, the graceful Brazilian girl who took it from her last year. That made a first-ever clean sweep for Australians in the singles brackets. Roy Emerson, men's champion, retained his crown in a low-pressure men's singles final Friday.

Palmer, Nicklaus Made Favorites

SOUTHPORT, England (AP)—Britain's legal bookies have ignored the two long-hitting Americans as the favorites for the British Open golf crown. Nicklaus, who needs only the British title to become the fourth man in history to complete a career sweep of the world's four major titles, was made a 7-to-2 choice last week. Palmer was second at 5-to-1.

Sammy Snead Retains Title

FORMBY, England (AP)—Sam Snead Sunday defended successfully his world senior golf championship title even though he conceded he wasn't "exactly a firecracker out there." The White Sulphur Springs, W. Va., professional defeated Britain's Charlie Ward one-up in 37 holes to retain the Teachers' title on the 8,862-yard, par-73 Formby links, seven miles from Southport where the 1965 British Open championship will be held starting Wednesday.

Canadian Girl Wins Hurdles

COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP)—Jennifer Wingerson of Toronto sped to victory in the 220-metre hurdles at the women's track and field championships of the U.S. amateur athletic union Saturday night. Miss Wingerson trailed Chicago's Marnie Rallins across the last hurdle, but passed her in the straightaway to win in 27.5 seconds.
