

Saints in Series Lip Montague 2-1

St. Dunstan's High School defeated Montague High 2-1 at the SUD rink Saturday to even up the Intermediate semifinals at 1-1. Montague won the first game of the series Friday 8-3 on home ice. The next game to be played Wednesday night at Montague.

Montyre Fires 'Hatrick' Royals Blast Millionaires

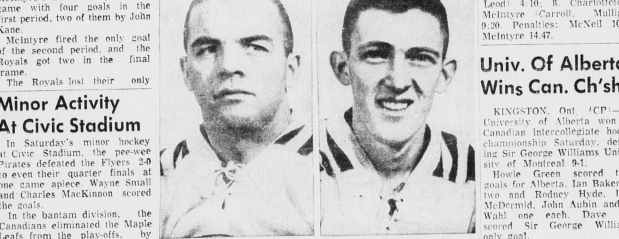

Maple Leafs Trip Rangers; Detroit Downs Chicago

NEW YORK (AP) - Defenseman Tim Horton's seventh winning goal of the National Hockey League season provided Toronto Maple Leafs with a 5-1 victory Sunday night over New York Rangers before 15,367 people at Madison Square Garden.

The triumph was the third in a row for the third-place Maple Leafs, battling to stay ahead of four-place Detroit.

The crowd set a new season attendance record for the Rangers of 483,161. The previous record of 472,227 was established two years ago.

Horton's goal, his ninth of the season, came seven seconds after the Rangers had tied the score 1-1 on a goal screened shot by defenseman Jim Neilson.

Don McKenzie scored the opening Toronto goal late in the first period and Dave Keon put the clinching Maple Leaf goal into an unprotected net with one second to clock.
