

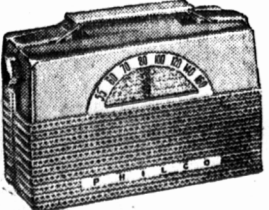

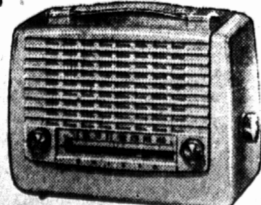

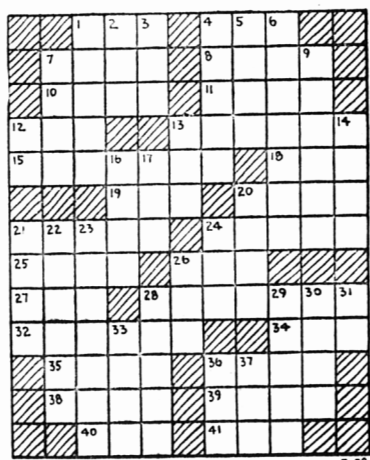

However, even if East rises to this crisis, the defense can't "relax." Declarer has another string in his bow. He captures East's heart jack, cashes the heart ace as well, and then cashes the two top spades. Now it is West who must be alert. If West does not see the need for unblocking his spade queen under the ace or king, declarer simply leads a third round of spades. Now the fulfilling trick will be dummy's thirteenth spade.

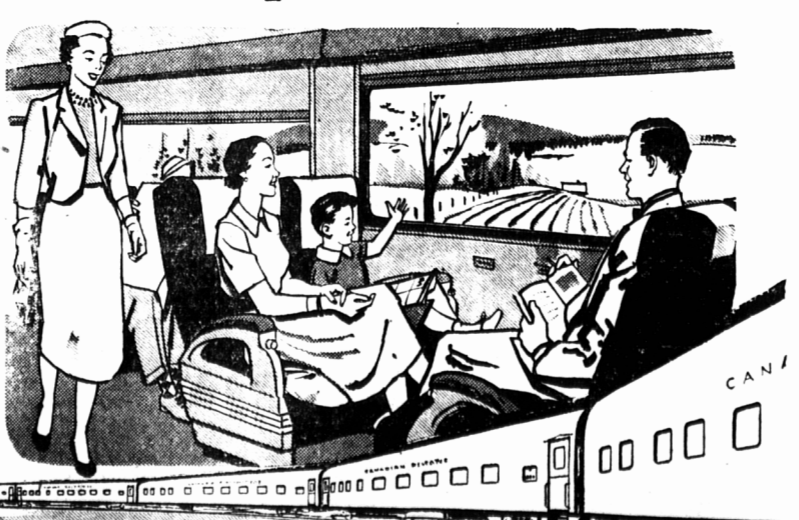
