U. S. Steel Demand Loses Some of Zip

CLEVELAND (AP) - Steel demand in the United States has lost some of its zip, Steel Magazine says, but the setup is not reflected in any slackening in steel-making operations.

The U. S. ingot production rate held unchanged at 86.5 per cent of rated capacity for its fourth straight week. This is equal to an output of about 2,375,000 net tons a week, or better than the average weekly production in any month except two during the record year of 1955.

Steel repeats its confident outlook that last year's record of 117,000,000 net tons would be topped this year with the production of at least 122,000,000 tons.

Even if the steel industry is not hit by a strike this summer, the metal-working weekly says, production will sag in the third quarter. Seasonal factors will cut output, but not below 85 per cent of capacity.

ASKS POSITIVE THINKING "With demand for heavy products continuing unabated, some steel men are confident of maintaining close-to-capacity production through the summer," the periodicals reports.

Steel calls the firmness of the capital expenditure program one of the most salient features of the economy today.

"Businessmen are not slowing down their capital expenditure plans to coincide with any temporary lull in the general economy."

"As long as businessmen think positively, the uptrend will continue," one industry executive said.

Steel's price composite on finished steel was steady at \$128.96 a net ton but its composite on steel-making grades of scrap slipped for the sixth successive week, dropping \$1 to \$46.17 a gross ton. The high of \$55.33 was recorded in the week ended April 25.

ARMY GOOD SAYS MONTY LONDON (Reuters) - Field Marshal Viscount Montgomery, deputy supreme allied commander in Europe, returned to London by air Wednesday from a three-week visit to Canada where he met the Canadian chiefs of staff. At London airport he said: "The post-war Canadian army is excellent - better than the Canadian army of the late war."
