HALEFAX (CP) — The weather office says a disturbance, which had earlier been expected to give a light snowfall to parts of Nova Scotia, now appears to be following a track which will take it farther away from the Maritimes. This will allow an area of high pressure to cross our district today which should result in considerable sunshine in all regions except just along the Atlantic coast of Nova Scotia.

Another disturbance, moving east from Manitoba, will bring cloudy skies, precipitation, and milder air to the Maritimes Friday.
