**Round Table Victorious  
In Bay Meadows Derby**

NEW YORK (CP)—Round Table waltzed to an easy 4 1/2-length victory in the \$52,000 Bay Meadows Derby at San Mateo, Calif., Saturday.  
Favored Swirling Abbey was second, Irishman ran third.  
Time for the 1 1/16-mile race was 1:41.3, fastest ever run by a three-year-old over the Bay Meadows strip. It was 45 of a second off the track record set by Bobby Brocato, also owned by the Kerr stables of Oklahoma City.  
Round Table paid \$5.60 to win.  
At Miami, Fla., Needles won the \$25,000 Fort Lauderdale Handicap and equalled the track record for 1 1/16 miles at 1:42 at Gulfstream Park. Tussle Patch ran second and Granale Canyon third.  
Needles, a 3-to-5 favorite, returned \$3.30, \$3.20 and \$2.70.  
At Jamaica Race Track here, King Halran, ridden by Eddie Artero, won the \$23,000 swift stake.

In a driving stretch run on a muddy track, Missile was second, Clem third in the six-furlong race. The winner picked up \$13,750.  
At Laurel, Md., Infatuation won the \$11,180 Cherry Blossom handicap.  
Double Bid, took the \$10,000 Springfield Handicap at Lincoln Downs, Lincoln, R.I.

**Fight Title To Be  
Iced By Dai Dower**

LONDON (AP)—Welshman Dai Dower arrived home Thursday from his disastrous trip to Argentina and kicked up a minor storm by declaring he did not intend to fight again until he finished 18 months of army service.  
The tiny 23-year-old boxer, who was knocked out in the first round by Argentina's Pascual Perez in a world flyweight title bout March 30, said he would defend his British and British Empire 112-pound crown when he was released from military duty.

Dower's manager, Nat Seller, asserted that his fighter had every right to "ice" the titles while in the army.  
Teddy Waltham, secretary of the British board of boxing control, said "the stewards may have to consider introducing legislation to deal with it. It is obviously undesirable for titles to be frozen for two years. It's bad for the game and unfair to challengers."  
In explaining his quick knockout loss to the undefeated world champion, Dower said ruefully: "I forgot to duck."

**38, May Go To  
Work First Time**

MIDDLESBROUGH, England (Reuters) — Leslie Towell, 38, yawned, scratched himself lazily and contemplated going to work for the first time in his life.  
He confounded a court here Monday with the bland disclosure: "I haven't done a day's work in my life."  
Later, relaxed in an armchair, Leslie told reporters: "I am not one of the idle rich. Just idle."  
The closest brush he ever had with outright work was during his six years in the army — but he explained that away.  
"The army understood me and I understood the army. I had a very easy life — and because my desires were so easy to satisfy, I saved £500 (\$1,400)."

**MOTHER'S PENSION HELPED**  
Life went well for him on that nest egg amplified by his mother's pension, he said. But since her death a year ago, he has run low of cash. He gets unemployment pay of £2 3s weekly.  
In court, Leslie admitted stealing chocolate and oranges worth five shillings. He was fined £1 and ordered to pay 15 shillings in court costs.  
Leslie said Tuesday: "Everyone connected with the case seemed amazed that I don't work. That's the trouble with civilization."  
"Everyone's preoccupied with work, and they haven't time for leisure."  
Asked how he will pay the court fine, Leslie shook his head.  
"I haven't got a half-penny," he said. "There seems to be only one thing for it—work."

**He Collects  
Pets Galore**

KIRKLAND LAKE, Ont. (CP)—Every child should have at least one pet, wise mothers say. But Thomas Haley, 13, who lives in nearby Gold Centre, didn't stop at one.  
He started bringing home strays and injured birds and animals four years ago. A recent count showed he had a crow, a cat, a budgie, a dog, a woodchuck, a finch, a rabbit, a chipmunk and nine canaries.  
Young Thomas had a snake and an owl, too, until the snake died recently and the owl was donated to the Ontario lands and forests department for an exhibition.  
Most of the pets are in cages, so wrangles are few.

**Runners To Try  
For 3:55 Mile**

LONDON (AP) — Two British Olympic runners agreed Thursday to run a mile race that many experts predict will bring the dream clocking of 3:55.  
Ken Wood and Derek Ibbotson are the runners pitted for that amazing time — three seconds faster than John Landy's outdoor world record and 8.6 seconds faster than the best time indoors by Denmark's Gunnar Nielsen, made in the United States.  
The race will be run at Manchester's indoor stadium April 17. That's the reason for the 3:55 hopes. The track is set in a natural bowl, heavily banked and runners say it is like running downhill all the way.  
A month ago Wood clocked 3:27.4 in a "blunder" mile. An after-the-race check showed that the distance was 112 yards short of the required 1,760 yards. If Wood had completed the mile at the same speed, then he would have hit 3:55 or thereabouts.
