### OPINION IN BELFAST.

**Organize For the Contest—Old Liberals Coming Over.**

BR.—It is a notice the Conservative electors of Orwell Cove, Point Ferm and Eldon met in Eldon Hall on Wednesday night, the 17th inst., for the purpose of organizing for the forthcoming election. The Conservatives are fully alive to the importance of the present struggle, and are determined to do their whole duty: and use every honest means to haul from power an aggregation of men who have defiled the temple of truth, thrown honor and honesty to the winds, and trampled in the mire the fair fame of our country.

### TWO STEAMERS COLLIDE
