Decline In Stock Prices Foesseen For Next 2 Months

MONTREAL (CP)—A special indicator published by the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges shows Canadian stock prices are likely to decline steadily in the next two months.

The indicator is called the Montreal Stock Price Trend Indicator, and it forecasts the movement of prices for six weeks from the present.

Its designer, Deep S. Hall, 35, says the indicator is a research director for the exchanges, says its accuracy has been "70 per cent" in the last 10 years.

After hitting a temporary high of 80.5 in the first week of May, the indicator has been falling steadily, hitting 41.1 in its latest computation Friday. Meanwhile the exchanges' 85-stock composite index has been relatively constant, showing a loss of less than two per cent during the same period.

The indicator readings, such as 41.1, are actually percentages. They are based on research which involves adding the total number of stocks advancing in one day to the number of stocks declining, which were traded but unchanged. The resulting total is then expressed as a percentage of the total number of issues traded that day.

Each week an average for the five days is made, and this figure is then averaged out over four weeks. This is done to put the movement within a five-week scope and produce less erratic fluctuations, Hall says.

The key reading is 50 per cent. The indicator is rising above 50 per cent and rising steadily. This forewarns a fall in stock prices within three to six weeks.

When the indicator is below 50 per cent and falling steadily, as it is now, a decline is indicated.

It says the indicator has a second purpose. A business cycle is made up of many factors, some of which occur before others.

It is generally agreed among economists, he says, that stock prices are a "leading indicator"—among the first signs of a general economic recovery. Other leading indicators are construction figures and new manufacturing orders.

"An analogy is a parade of balloons turning a corner," he says. "The balloons represent indicators—turn the corner before the parade does. The general economic picture, the equivalent to the middle line, and the parade line represents some indicators, such as retail sales, which lag behind the general economic picture."

Nuclear Arms Announcement Is Expected

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister Foesseen said here he hopes "very shortly" to be able to make an announcement about an agreement with the United States for acquisition of nuclear arms.

He made the statement during a rapid-fire Commons exchange with former Conservative defence minister Douglas Harkness who suggested the Liberals were showing reluctance to complete the arrangements with the Americans.

Mr. Harkness asked whether the agreement had yet been signed with the Americans and, if not, what caused the delay? Mr. Pearson replied that it wasn't signed and the reason was that the government wanted to make sure that when it is signed it is a "proper agreement."

Mr. Harkness retorted that such an agreement is a simple one and the only delay could be reluctance by the Liberals to sign it.

Mr. Pearson, apparently surprised by this observation, replied that it took the Conservative government three years to decide to do nothing about such an agreement.

If there was any delay it was not due to the actions of the Canadian side in the negotiations, he added.
