# AGRICULTURAL NEWS

P.E.I. Department of Agriculture

**ARTIFICIAL BREEDING**

Thirteen Clubs are now operating in Prince Edward Island. This provides a service to all cattle owners wishing to use Artificial Insemination in their breeding programme. Nine different breeds are available daily. Holsteins, Ayrshire, Jersey, Guernsey, Dual Purpose, Beef Short-horn, Hereford, Red Poll and Aberdeen Angus. If you want service phone the inseminator in your area before 10 a.m. for the service that day.

**EASTERN PRINCE**

Ken Walker, inseminator for the Eastern Prince County Artificial Breeding Club has moved, in Summerside, recently. His telephone number, as a consequence, has changed. It is now Summerside 2700.

**MARKED INCREASE**

In the Province last year 11,647 cattle were bred artificially on over 2200 different farms. This shows an increase of 4314 over 1956. The number of cattle bred in each club for the year is as follows. The four new Clubs operated only nine months namely, West Prince, Crapaud, New Glasgow and Morell. West Prince (346), O'Leary (1462), Tyne Valley (620), Eastern Prince (1939), New Glasgow (510), Cornwall (825), York (807), Hillsboro (1047), Morell (370), Montague (938) and Eastern Kings (804).

**BRUCELOSIS**

The three countries, Prince, Queens and Kings were the first

in Canada to be declared Certified Brucellosis Control Areas. All the cattle in the Province have been blood tested. The reactors, which were very few were slaughtered. The farms where reactors were uncovered were all re-tested until the animals were found to be negative.

In the month of June 1957 the County of Colchester in Nova Scotia commenced testing. According to available information other areas in the Province will be tested as soon as arrangements can be completed.

In New Brunswick work along the today's accepted eradication measures have been undertaken since 1937. These tested areas, it is understood, will now be re-tested under the new Federal Policy for Bangs Disease Eradication. The county of York has recently been declared a Brucellosis Control Area. Testing is well underway.

# Tries To Open Shop, Loses Both Job And Wife

ETON, England (Reuter). - A man who tried to open a fish and chips shop within sniffing distance of Eton college claimed Tuesday that public opinion given the case cost him his job and his wife.

Dennis White, 28, told a public inquiry here he plans to claim £300 from the local urban council because their "incompetence" had cost him so much money he could not go ahead with his plans.

The Eton council first approved White's request for permission to open the shop but later reversed it.

White said the furor over the case caused a separation from his wife and that his four children have been placed in a home.

The owner of an antique book shop beside the site of the proposed shop told the board of inquiry today that his customers - including the top-hatted Eton students - would be driven away by the smell of the cooking next door. He said the smell would also ruin his valuable prints and books.
