TORONTO (CP) — Despite all the fine talk, Canadians seem to rate higher education as a second-class activity when it comes to financial support, Davidson Dunton said Monday night. "We honor it with much talk," said the former CBC chief who now is president of Ottawa's Carleton University. But "we simply are not matching our words with action and with spending."

is deadly serious for our society in future. The responsibility for greater support of higher education lies not with governments but with the Canadian public generally, he said. "We watch and chop and cut expenditures on education while we spend millions on longer wings for cars that do not even take us any place more efficiently than before."

Adenauer At 83 Years Will Run For President

BONN, Germany (Reuters)—Konrad Adenauer, the stern, anti-Communist leader of West Germany for the last 10 years, agreed Tuesday to run for the West German presidency—a decision that could virtually take him out of active politics. The 83-year-old chancellor bowed to the wishes of his ruling Christian Democratic Party and accepted the nomination for the post, which carries little political authority. His decision stunned West German politicians—including members of his own party—and set off a political bombshell in other Western capitals, busily preparing for negotiations with Russia next month on the future of this divided country. Adenauer, who has run the West German government with a firm hand since its inception 10 years ago, served notice just two months ago that he hoped to run for a fourth term as chancellor in 1961. His nomination for the presidency came at a time when his inflexibility in dealing with Russia was causing concern among West Germany's western allies, particularly Britain. Adenauer always has opposed mak-

ing any concessions in negotiations with the Soviet Union and has clung firmly to the principle of eventual German reunification. What moved Adenauer to accept his party's call was a subject for intense debate. Some said his followers were irked by what they call the inflexibility of his foreign policy, and wanted to kick him upstairs. Others suggested Adenauer intends to revise the role of the presidency and make it a more powerful voice in German affairs. The vote for a new president to replace retiring Theodor Heuss will take place in Berlin July 1. If Adenauer is elected, he will relinquish direction of the West German government Sept. 15. MUST RETIRE? Under the German constitution, Heuss must retire after completing his second five-year term next July. The president is elected by a college made up of deputies of the West German Lower House and representatives of state legislatures. Although he is opposed by popular Social Democrat Carlo Schmid, Adenauer is expected to win easily.
