Simpsons-Sears Plans New store Location

Construction of a new building to house the Charlotte branch of Simpson-Sears Ltd., got underway yesterday morning with the vacant site at 154-156 Kent Street.

The lot, which has a 40-foot frontage and runs to the depth of 160 feet, was formerly owned by Morton Dew. It is situated between the Block and Tanton Buildings, directly opposite the firm of Douglas Bros. and Jones in the uptown section of the city which was occupied for some time as a used-car lot.

The Simpson-Sears Ltd. store destroyed by fire last spring. The firm had planned to rebuild on the old site, but moved, on a change of plans, to the new location.

Gov't-Union Plan Meeting
