The search Committee for the Dean of the School of Business Administration invites nominations of candidates for the position of Dean of the School of Business. The Committee is looking for an internal candidate who, if successful, would take up the office as of July 1, 1992. The Committee will accept nominations, including self-nominations, from within the University. The position is open to all eligible faculty, including the incumbent Dean. Nominators must ensure that their candidate is willing to stand prior to submitting his/her name.

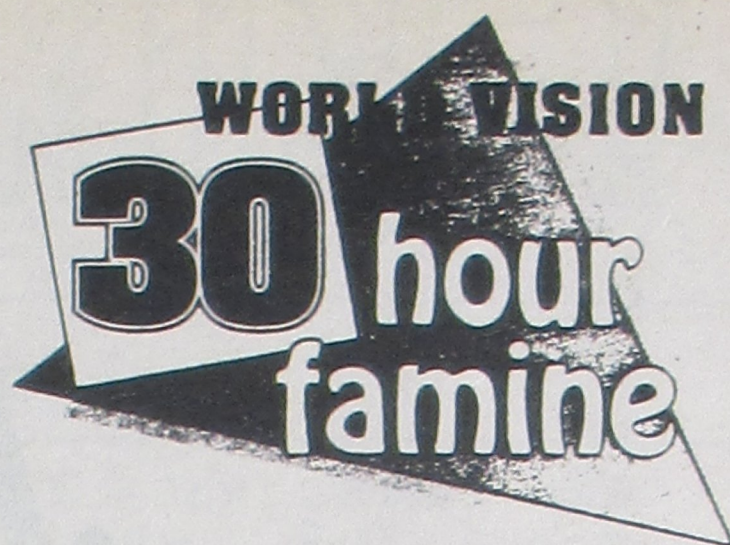
Nominations should be sent in writing to the Chair of the search Committee, Verner Smitheram, Dean of Arts, no later than Monday, February 10, 1992 at 12:00 noon.

Candidate for the position should possess the following qualifications:

- the minimum academic qualification of a Master's and/or equivalent degree;
- a tenured position at the University;
- significant experience in administration, research and teaching and service on university, scholarly, or business/professional committee;
- interpersonal/communication skills;
- sensitivity and responsiveness to the concerns and needs of the Business faculty, students, and community.

All comments about candidates should be presented in writing to the Search Committee, and addressed to the Chair. The confidentiality of written presentations will be honoured.
