TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) — The stock market was irregularly lower Friday amid slow trading. Base metals continued in their weakened state to drop to a 1956-57 index low. Advocate bucked the trend in the mining list, posting a 45-cent gain at \$6.90. East Sullivan, however, lost 80 cents at a new low of \$2.90 while Stanrock Uranium was down 35 cents to a low of \$3.05. Senior base metals were lower in fractional-range trading. Fargo was a feature among western oils, climbing 65 cents to \$8.40. Canada Southern lost 60 cents at \$7.00 and Canso Natural Gas was off 35 cents to \$1.90. Canada Oil Lands gained 35 cents at \$3.75. Royalty was off a point to 20 among senior issues.

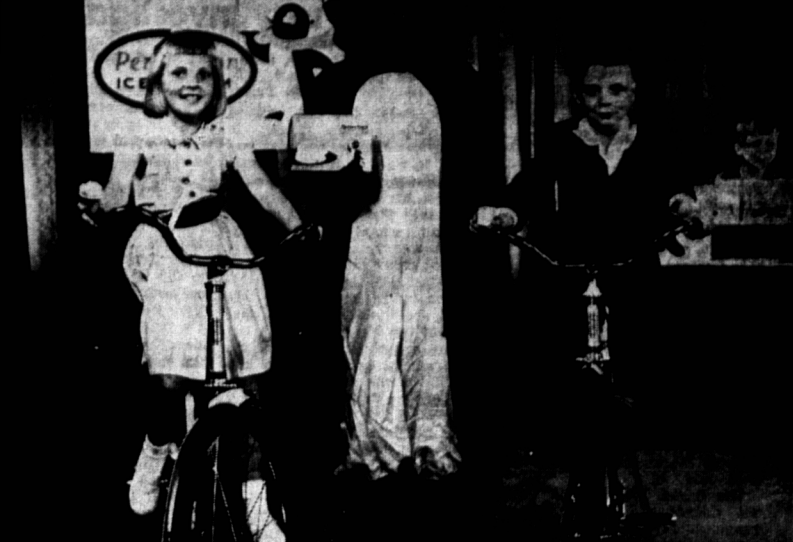
