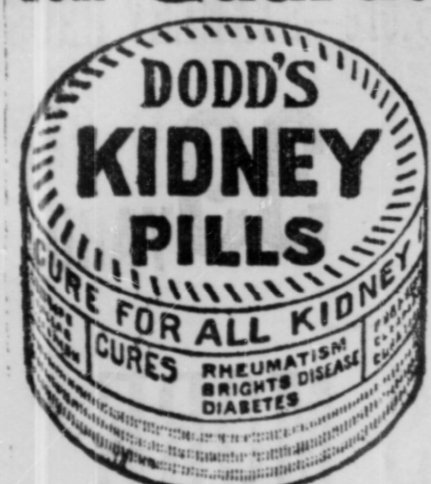

The way, then, to keep love secure in married life is not so much to be anxiously watching and guarding lest it should escape, or crying that love has spread its wings because the first holiday romance is replaced by graver feeling, but by living along simply and honestly and frankly together on a high plane, looking most and always toward 'whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report.' Then Love will be not a captive, but a most willing guest.

A WIFE SHOULD INSIST ON AN ALLOWANCE

I wish here to emphasize the fact which so many husbands and wives seem to forget—that marriage is on one side as much a business contract as any other partnership, and demands exactly the same business treatment. The husband is the earner, the wife is the distributor, of capital, and of the two her work is really the more complex and difficult. How to Treat a Cut,

Adhesive plaster ought to be the best procurable, and instead of keeping it in a roll in the drawer it ought to be cut into strips of different breadths. It is thus ready for immediate use, and there is no chance of its sticking together as it does if kept in bulk. When it is necessary to use this plaster to keep the edges of the wound together, we must be careful first and foremost to see that the wound is perfectly clean, and that no sand, glass or grit is in it, which would cause festering and prevent it from healing.

Never cover a wound wholly up with piece of plaster; whatever be its size use long narrow strips. Warm the plaster by holding the back of it against a can of boiling water for a few seconds, then apply it across the wound, leaving a small space between

each strip to give exit to the lymph. Remember that sticking plaster has no healing action in itself, and the benefits derived from its use are of a purely mechanical nature. Clean cuts are better bound up with blood, simply with a linen rag, for sticking plaster is of no use until the bleeding stops. In case of scalp wounds, the hair must be shaved off before the plaster is applied.—Medical Journal.

They are really just as tender as the hands, though having been covered from infancy with hard leather and ill-fitting hose, they have grown used to limited space and care.
