Home runs came early as Kirkpatrick lofted a solo shot in the second inning and Jose Cardenal did the same for his No. 7 in the third.

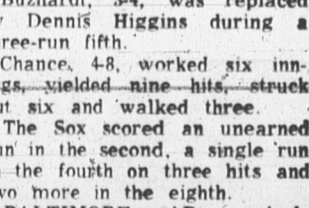
