 Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island: Cloudy with widely scattered showers; not much change in temperature; southerly winds 15. Low-high at Halifax 55 and 70, Yarmouth 48 and 65, Kentville, New Glasgow, Goshen, Charlottetown, Moncton, Fredericton, Edmundston and Campbellton 50 and 70, Sydney 45 and 70, Saint John 50 and 65, Bay of Fundy: Southerly winds 15, increasing in afternoon to southwest 20; cloudy with a few showers; fog patches in afternoon and evening; visibility 10 miles, lowers in showers to two miles and in fog to near zero; temperature near 50.

High tide today at Charlottetown at 7.15 a.m. and 8.57 p.m. At Rustico at 2.54 a.m. Summerside tide eighteen minutes later than Charlottetown. Sun rises today at 4.30 a.m. and sets at 8.03 p.m.
