N. Y. Stocks

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market advanced Thursday and came within a giant's stride of its all-time record high peak.

Behind the rise market men underlined the Senate banking committee adjournment of the continued high level of U. S. economic activity, heavy demand for steel, the pressure for higher prices for copper, anticipated excellent first-quarter earnings reports, and the rise of 5 per cent in dividend payments in January and February over a year ago.

Baldwin-Lima-Hamilton was Thursday's most active issue up 1 1/2 to 1 3/4. The Atomic Energy Commission gave its okay for a joint study of atomic locomotives by the company with Denver and Rio Grande Western Railroad. The latter gained 3/4 at 11 1/4.

Chrysler was second up 3/4 at 73. General Dynamics was third up 3/4 at 72 1/2, and it was followed by Jones and Laughlin up 1/2 at 38 1/2, and Budd Co. up 1/2 at 20 1/2.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks stepped up \$1.40 at \$159.80. The record high was \$162.60 March 4. Volume was 3,170,000 shares.

Aluminum Co. of America jumped 1 1/2 points at 11 1/2 on a proposal for a two-for-one split and a higher dividend.

Canadian stocks were mixed at the close. Canadian Pacific and Dome Mines each added 1/4. International Nickel advanced 1/2. Hillier and an American Distillers Seagram both dropped 1/2. McIntyre was unchanged.

On the American stock exchange Lake Shore dropped 1/2 while Giant Yellowstone and Royalite were unchanged.
