

IN MEMORIAM

ELISHA B. DOYLE

The death of Elisha B. Doyle in his sixty-first year occurred at his home in Savage Harbor on Jan. 2, 1952.

The late Mr. Doyle, who was born at Point De Roche, P.E.I., was the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. John R. Doyle.

"Lush" as he was familiarly known throughout Savage Harbor and surrounding districts, had been ailing for the past three years. Despite this fact, his many friends, both young and old were greatly shocked and saddened by his sudden death.

Mr. Doyle, after a four week period spent in Charlottetown Hospital, returned to his home on December 8, 1951, where he was tenderly cared for by his wife and all members of his devoted family, including that of two married daughters and one unmarried son, all of whom reside in Ontario.

On January 2nd, Mr. Doyle's condition became worse and as the day faded so did his strength and life. In the late afternoon he was visited by his pastor, the Rev. Fr. T. Campbell, who administered the last rites of Holy Mother Church, of which Mr. Doyle was a devoted member.

He leaves to mourn, his beloved wife, eight sons, four daughters, one brother, two sisters and three grandchildren.

The largely attended funeral, which was held on the morning of January 5th, proceeded from the deceased's late residence to St. Andrew's Church, where a Requiem High Mass was celebrated by the Rev. Fr. T. Campbell, who also officiated at the grave.
