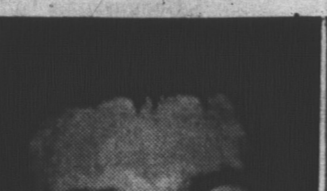


MARR FINISHES HOLE-IN-ONE ROUND

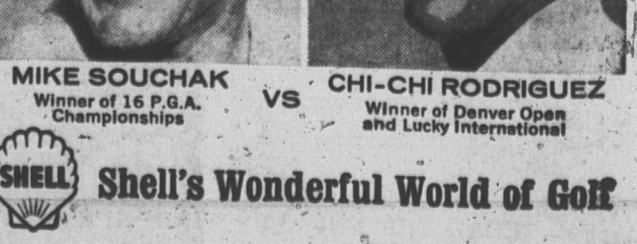
