New Deal For Whales Seen In Prospect

By Glenna Currie. LONDON, June 10 (Reuters)—A "new deal" for whales is in prospect. The fourth session of the International Whaling Commission starts here tomorrow, with delegates from 17 countries including Canada presenting their ideas on how to halt the extinction of the mammals.

One proposal is to lower the international whaling quota, now set at 16,000 blue whale "units" a year. Basic unit is one blue whale, two min whales, 2 1-2 humpback whales or six narwhals. Norway, biggest whaling country, favors this scheme.

Present quota was fixed in 1946 and the uncontrolled slaughter of whales, now badly needed for their oil, meat and by-products.

East and West will sit opposite each other over the conference tables, with Britain, United States and Russia stating their views. Other countries represented are: Japan, Brazil, Mexico, Panama, Australia, Denmark, France, The Netherlands, Iceland, New Zealand, Sweden and South Africa. Observers are present from Argentina, Chile, Honduras, Italy and Portugal.

Principal subjects include: complete protection of certain species in danger of extinction; size limits on other species; shorter, staggered seasons to let the whales get fatter; the falling price of whale oil; common adoption of the electric harpoon, a quick, painless killer compared with the explosive-head harpoon; and other technical and biological aspects of the industry.

Main problem is the whole population. The animals, which have a life span of about one-third that of man, produce one young every two or three years.

To get a approximation of the present population, "census" forms are being issued to merchant ships, asked to report all whales sighted. The integrated reports will be used in the study of conservation of stock in the Antarctic, main whaling area and in the study of international regulations concerning the animals.

The blue, fin and humpback whales are all species of the rorqual family, and range up to 100 feet long in the case of blues. They spend most of their time in the polar regions, mainly the Antarctic, returning as far as the tropics to breed.

Narwhals are much smaller, up to about 16 feet long, and do not migrate like the rorquals.

Large U. S. Wheat Crop Predicted. WASHINGTON, June 10 (AP)—A wheat crop of 1,326,157,000 bushels—the second largest on record—was forecast by the Agriculture Department today.
