

Quash Conviction For Low Flying; New Trial Looms

OTTAWA (CP)—The court martial appeal board has unanimously quashed the conviction of an RCAF officer on a charge of low flying and has ordered a new trial.

Edwards, 23, of Bracken, Sask., guilty of low flying and sentenced him to a severe reprimand and a \$200 fine. A severe reprimand usually prevents any possible promotion for years.

In a rider to the main judgment, board member George Addy said the RCAF court "manufactured" evidence in the case and that a procedure it had used was "completely illegal."

Edwards appealed to the civilian, five-member court martial appeal board.

The RCAF court martial on Dec. 20, 1957, found FO Russel T. Edwards, 23, of Bracken, Sask., guilty of low flying and sentenced him to a severe reprimand and a \$200 fine.

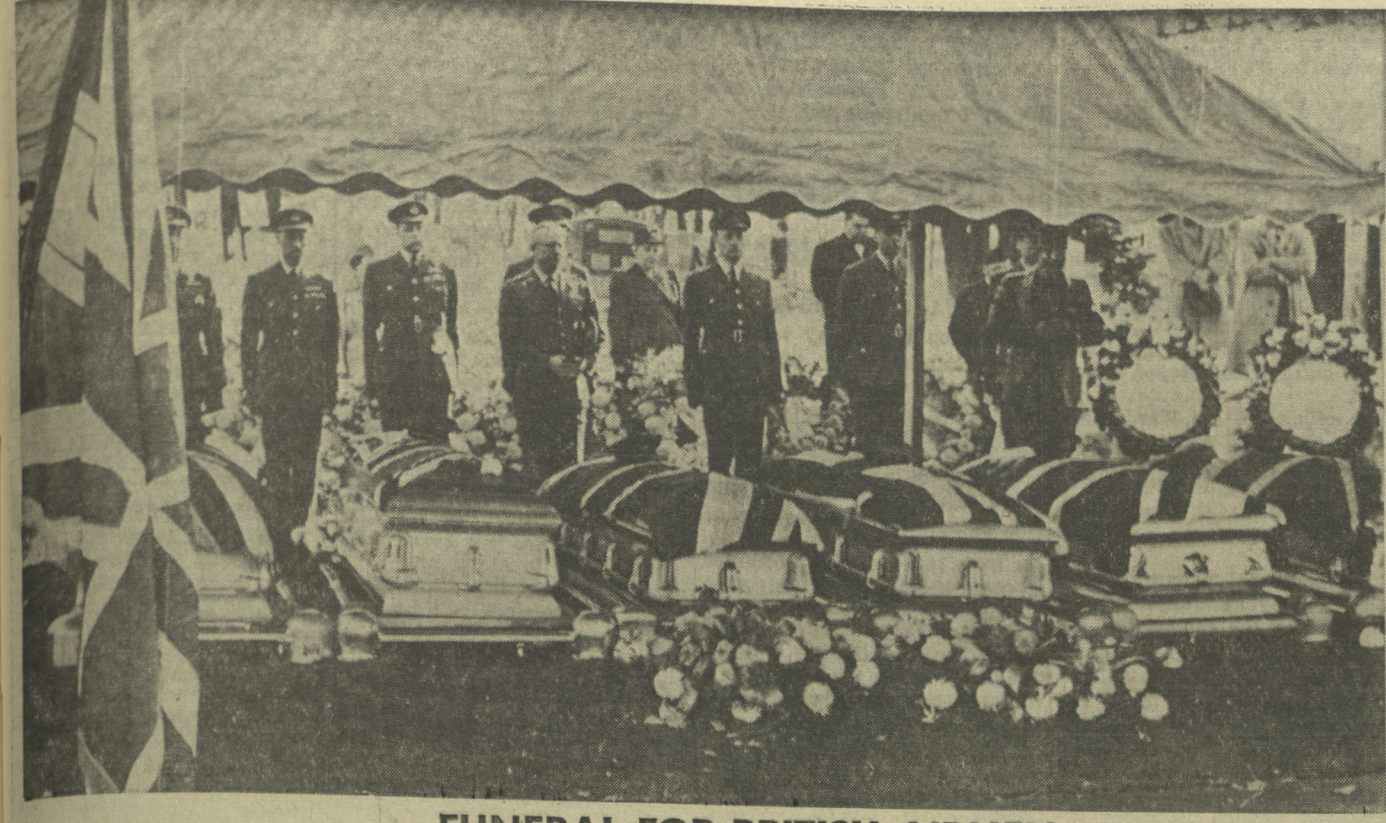

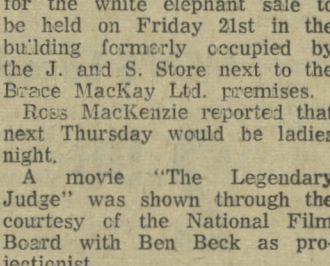
