"DR." ROSSIN SUICIDES.

He Takes a Dose of Strichnine and Dies from the Effects.

Frank Rossin, better known as "Dr." Rossin, is dead. He committed suicide last night at the residence of W. S. McKie, Esq., Hillsborough Street. The body will be interred in the People's Cemetery this afternoon.

Rossin came to this Province about five or six years ago, and for several years resided at Summerside, where he opened an office for the practice of medicine. A year or so ago he removed to New Glasgow, where he continued to practice. On Wednesday last he came into town and had been in the city ever since. He slept at Mr. McKie's, and they would see him, on an average, about once or twice during each day. Yesterday he was about town, and he called at the police station in the afternoon and complained of a severe pain in the left side. In the evening he was again about town and talked freely of having his diploma registered and joining the Medical Association.

About ten o'clock last night he was upstairs in one of the bedrooms at Mr. McKie's. He had a bottle of whiskey in his possession as well as a small bottle containing strichnine, and he told one of Mr. McKie's boys, Eddie, who was upstairs at the time, that he intended to poison himself. When the doctor arrived, however, Rossin was beyond the reach of medical skill. He was rapidly passing from time to eternity. A faint heart-beat was the only visible sign of life.

The bottle which contained the strichnine was found behind the bed where Rossin had thrown it. The authorities were notified and a jury was empanelled. Coroner McLeod and the jury viewed the body this forenoon, and the inquest will be held this evening at half-past seven, in the police court office.

The jury is composed of Messrs Allan (foreman), Joseph Warren, George Thorne, John Proud, George Essey, John Brown, and George Oiler.

The body was removed to Mark Wright & Co's undertaking room this forenoon. So far as known, Rossin has no relatives in this Province.
