TROUBLE IN INDIA.
The Ameer's Troops to the Rescue.
Fishermen to be Kept in Check.

LONDON, Sept 7.—The Times Simla correspondent says that in addition to dispersing the Laghmanis who had been collected by the Mullah disciples and were about to join the Mullah, the Ameer's troops scattered a body of Khinwaris who had assembled near Peshlah intending to hold the Kyber pass for the Afridis. The Ameer, the correspondent says, is plainly determined to keep the tribesmen in check and measures will be taken by his orders that will cripple the Mullah power and probably prevent a further rising.

MANITOBA QUESTION AGAIN.
Likely to be Re-Opened in Deference to the Pope.

OTTAWA, Sept 7.—There is a rumor current here that Hon. Messrs Greenway Cameron and McMillan are coming to Ottawa as soon as Mr. Laurier returns to have a further conference on the school question, which is now settled to the satisfaction of the Pope who requires that some further concessions shall be made by the Manitoba Government.

MONTREAL, Sept 7.—On Thursday next the steamer Merrimac will leave for England, carrying two carloads of fresh fruit and vegetables in cold storage. This is the first attempt.

TRADE IN THE STATES.
Henry Clews, of New York, reports that trade movements show no abatement of their universally hopeful aspect. In the merchandise markets, the increased demand is producing a steady advance in prices. The iron trade continues to gain in activity, and the rise in values is extending over the whole range of metallic products. The woolen factories are clearing off their past accumulations of stocks and conservatively increasing their output. The cotton goods trade, though in a stage of the season when orders contract, is yet doing more than a good average business for this period of the year. Cotton has been showing a fairly firm tendency in spite of a prospective crop of 9,000,000 bales. In brief, in all the large branches of trade, there is the same story of conservative activity, increasing demand and an upward tendency in prices, while railroad earnings continue to show large increases.
