Musial set a National League record by playing in his 7,787th game and made it even more memorable by hitting a three-run homer that gave St. Louis a 3-0 victory over Cincinnati after Reds had taken the opener 5-4 on a wild pitch by Don Ferrarese.

Spahn continued to grind out victories, notching No. 312 while pitching Milwaukee to a 3-2 decision in the opener with Houston. Colts bounced back to win the second 9-1 on Dick Farrell's first complete game. Mejias reached Spahn for a homer and added two more in the second game.

## Lightning Bolt May Have Cost Shooter Crown

ST. JANVIER, Que. (CP)—A bolt of lightning may have cost Ottawa's brilliant Barney Hartman, an RCAF squadron-leader with Ken Sedlecky of Baldwin, Mich., when a lightning bolt creased the sky just as he shot for his 141st straight pigeon. He missed.

It was only his seventh miss in 716 shots in the three days of shooting. But it was enough to give U.S. naval rating Sedlecky the title with a score of 350.

Earlier in the three-day skeet championships, which ended Sunday in these Laurentian foothills, he won his seventh consecutive Canadian closed title with a record score of 494.

## Gendebien Cops Targa Florio

PALERMO, Sicily (AP)—Olivier Gendebien of Belgium drove a Ferrari to victory Sunday in the 447.4 miles Targa Florio auto race.

Gendebien teamed with countryman Willy Malresse and Mexican Ricardo Rodriguez to clock 7 hours, 2 minutes, 56.3 seconds for an average speed of 63.33 miles per hour.

Second went to the Italian team of Giancarlo Baghetti and Lorenzo Bandini, also in a Ferrari, followed by Nino Vaccarella of Italy and Jo Bonnier of Sweden in a Porsche.

With the victory, Gendebien became the only driver to win the Targa Florio three times. He won in 1958 when he teamed with an Italian, the late Luigi Musso, and in 1961. He has also won the Le Mans 24-hours race and Sebring 12-hour race three times.

The Porsche driven by Dan Gurney of Riverside, Calif., who is to race in Canada in June, ran off the road at a sharp curve during the second lap and was damaged. Gurney was not injured.

Higher payoffs have been made on multiple betting pools at Agua Caliente in Mexico. The biggest previous return in the United States was \$42,824.60 at Narragansett Park Oct. 28, 1961. Suffolk's previous high was \$39,412 in 1961.
