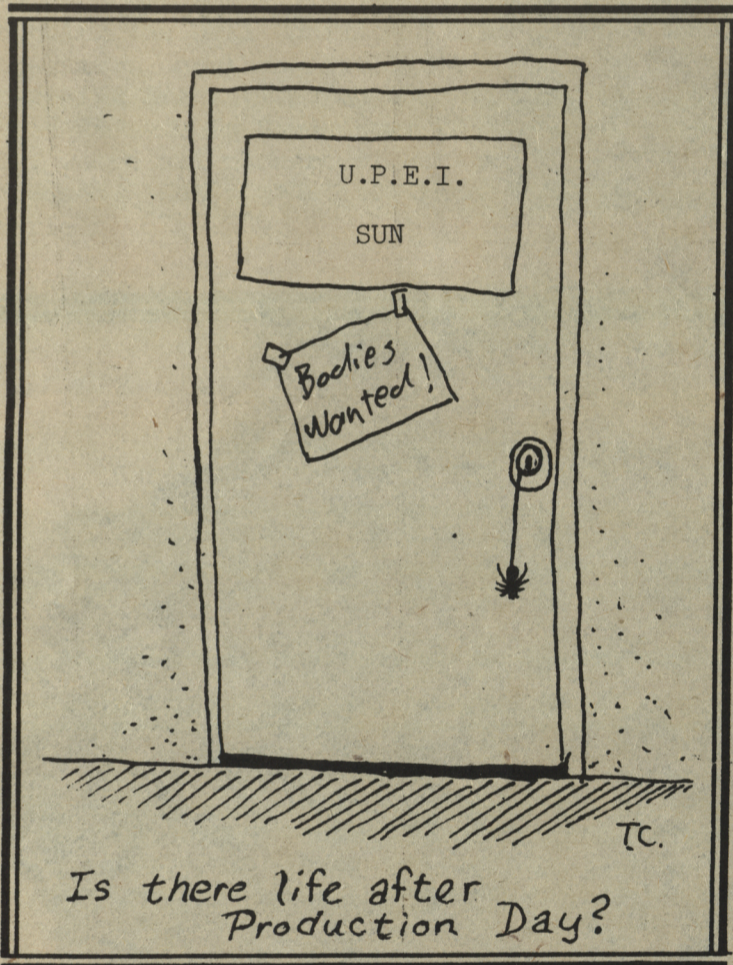


# RUMOR HATH IT

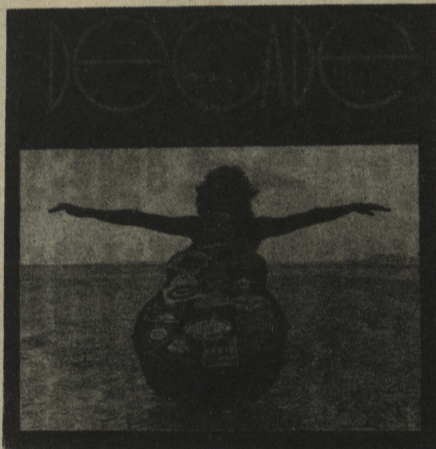
