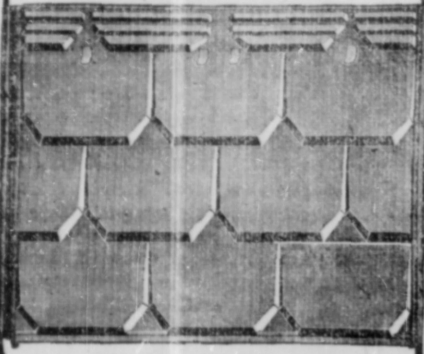

**SPRUCE FOR PULP**—An American forestry expert tells us that of the 1,660,000 acres of spruce in New Hampshire in 1870, there remain only 28,000 today. The consumption of spruce for pulp is increasing at the rate of 15 per cent. a year. The mills of New England and New York turn out 270,000 tons of paper pulp each year, which requires over 700,000,000 square feet of pulp wood, or the contents of 160,000 acres of land. These are facts which may well be pondered by those in Canada who do not sufficiently realize the future dependencies of the United States upon the spruce forests of Canada.

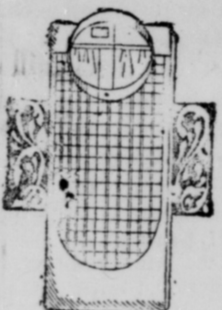
