Did You Know?

According to CFS Research:

Women account for half of the undergraduate full-time student population but...

- more women study part-time than men
- in the faculties of engineering and applied science women account for only 13% of the total student enrolment and make up just 2% of the faculty
- women account for less than half of the graduate student population
- women represent only 18% of university faculty

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
