

Vote Date  
For U.K.  
Seen Oct.

LONDON (CP)—The uncertainty over the British election may be resolved within 24 hours.  
An announcement is expected today and the forecast is for a date in October, possibly Thursday, Oct. 8.  
Prime Minister Sir Alec Douglas-Home is thought to have conveyed word of his decision to the Queen in a Buckingham Palace audience Wednesday.  
The Queen came to London on personal business from Windsor Castle, where the royal family is in residence. The audience was officially described as routine, but political sources acknowledge that it could also have been a momentous one if the prime minister did indeed break the election secret.  
Ominous has appeared to be hardening in the Conservative party in the last few days in favor of an October vote. Previously June was considered the most likely month. The election must be held by November.

**TO VOTE ALSO**  
This will be the first time in 40 years that Britain and the United States have had national elections in the same year. The U.S. presidential election will be in November.

If the announcement is made as expected, it will end the tantalizing, twisting uncertainty that has hung over the political scene off and on for nearly two years, with a special session marking recent weeks.

However, those forecasting an announcement were not certain whether Douglas-Home would make his announcement as the result of today's Greater London council election were tabulated. The prime minister's Conservative party has been faring poorly in similar local balloting throughout England this week, the opposition Labor party having made a net gain of 16 seats thus far.  
Meanwhile, an influential section of the cabinet was said to be pressing for an early election. This was reported to include Treasury Chief Reginald Maudslayi who unveiled the new national budget Tuesday.

**WIFE URGES NO REVENGE**

CLEVELAND (AP)—In quiet, even tones the wife of a minister cradled in death by a tractor in a civil rights demonstration here pleaded against any attempts to revenge his death.  
"Please put it in your paper that we do not want revenge," Mrs. Jo Anne Klunder, tiny 28-year-old wife of Rev. Bruce W. Klunder, asked a reporter.  
"Please help us reach our people. Revenge will gain nothing."

**12-Mile Limit Draws Comment**

HALIFAX (CP)—Nova Scotia's first fisheries minister said here a Canadian fishermen should be able to compete on the same basis as foreign trawlers and be allowed to "fish where they fish."  
Trade Minister E. A. Manson made the comment in an interview soon after he was sworn in Tuesday as the province's minister of fisheries.  
Asked to comment on the province's stand on the proposed 12-mile fishing limit, Mr. Manson said "the inshore fishery must be protected where it is applicable to protect it."  
Mr. Manson accepted the new portfolio at a noon ceremony at Province House presided over by Mr. Justice J. H. MacQuarrie of the Nova Scotia Supreme Court.  
The fisheries portfolio was set up during the recent session of the legislature.

**Moscow Radio Has Warning**

TEHRAN (AP)—Moscow radio, heard in Iran, has charged that the United States aims to try to get aerial photographs of Soviet territory adjacent to Iran in joint U.S.-Iranian military maneuvers next week. It warned against that and against the maneuvers in general.  
"Apparently Washington has not profited from the severe lesson it was taught in the last few weeks," the radio said, referring to the downing by Russian fighters of two American planes that strayed over East Germany. "If this is so, they will have to be taught better."  
The Russian-language broadcast said the U.S. armed forces intend to use RB-67 reconnaissance aircraft during the exercise, officially scheduled to be conducted over southern Iran and the Persian Gulf April 12-15.

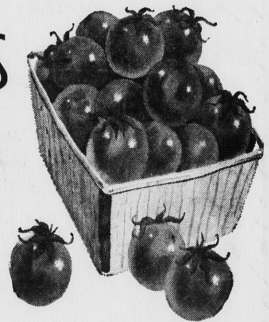
