McCARTHY STAFF DUE FOR SHAKEUP REGARDLESS OF RESULT OF PROBE - WASHINGTON (CP) - Whether it is win, lose or draw for him, Senator Joseph McCarthy's investigation of alleged Communists in government may never be the same again as the result of the spectacular inquiry into his dispute with army officials.

McCARTHY STAFF DUE FOR SHAKEUP REGARDLESS OF RESULT OF PROBE - The Wisconsin Republican senator wears the air of a man supremely confident of the outcome of the controversy created by army charges that he and his aides favored military treatment for millionaire draftee Pte. David Schine, a former unpaid McCarthy consultant.

McCARTHY STAFF DUE FOR SHAKEUP REGARDLESS OF RESULT OF PROBE - But even if McCarthy should prove to the satisfaction of a lot of people his counter-charge that Army Secretary Robert Stevens and his aides used Schine as a "bait" in efforts to halt McCarthy's Communist hunt, some investigative changes seem inevitable.

McCARTHY STAFF DUE FOR SHAKEUP REGARDLESS OF RESULT OF PROBE - For instance, there are some clear indications that even if he regards himself as completely exonerated, Roy M. Cohn is likely to step out as McCarthy's chief counsel and right-hand man.

The testimony of George Anastasia, another staffer, as to his role in Schine's delivery of the picture to McCarthy aides, seemed to leave some committee members with doubts in their minds about the events he described.
