When the doctor, or lawyer, or laborer, has a realization that his vocation is more than the mere fulfilling of a task for the sake of earning a living, when he realizes that it is the way God wants to be served, then there is an added incentive to do the particular work well.

And this sense of vocation can lend a deep joy to our work. Any good human activity should be accompanied by a real joy, a joy that is not really disturbed by the passing waves of melancholy and discouragement which engulf us from time to time. This joy is deepened, and our hold on it is more secure, with the realization that God has determined the circumstances of our activity, be it lawyer, policeman or mother; and that the fulfillment of the duties of our state of life is identical with our journey to Him, and it is for that union with Him that each of us was created.

During these weeks of Advent, as we prepare for the feast recalling the birthday of God's Son among us as Man, we might keep in mind the vocation of Mary, chosen to be God's mother.
