

Summerside Man Injured; Four Mishaps Investigated

SUMMERSIDE—The Summerside RCMP detachment investigated four accidents over the weekend, one involving a serious injury to a Summerside man Thomas P. Leppl, Victoria Road, Summerside, suffered compound fractures of legs and pelvis when he was struck by a 1954 Ford driven by Cpl. Edward Cameron of CFB Summerside on the highway between the base and Miscouche early Saturday morning.

The injured man's car was parked beside the highway and he believed he was about to change a tire when the accident occurred. Leppl was taken to the Prince County Hospital here by ambulance. Mr. and Mrs. Cameron were also taken to hospital where Mrs. Cameron was treated for shock and released. There was an estimate of \$3,000 damage to the vehicles involved last night.

At 5:40 Saturday morning a three-ton dump truck owned by Daniel Bryenton, Spring Valley, driven by James McKie, Ellerslie, slipped over the steel fence at the frozen food plant in New Annan when it went into the ditch off the highway be-

Blaze Destroys Store

SUMMERSIDE—A fire which broke out about 1:10 a.m. Sunday completely destroyed a general store of Alfred Gaudet at Miscouche, with all its contents lost.

The loss is estimated at \$75,000, and is partly covered by insurance.

The fire departments of Miscouche, Summerside, St. Eleazar, Wellington, Kensington and two units from CFB Summerside were at the scene.

The blaze began at the rear of the building, which is a storage area. The cause of the fire is unknown.

As well as a grocery store, Gaudet's was a service station and had a farm implements department in the rear of the building.
