long and strong minor suit. Neither of them varied their philosophy when East opened with one diamond and both Souths overcalled with three notrump.

At the first table the bidding then proceeded as shown and South became declarer at four notrump double. A bad slip in defense took place when East covered the ten of diamonds with the jack and South ran off ten tricks. East was aware that the three notrump overcall was the gambling variety, and his failure to take the ace of diamonds and play a heart in there, were difficult to justify.

At the second table the bidding followed this course:

West North East South  
Pass Pass 1♠ 2NT  
Pass Pass 4♠ 4NT  
Pass 4♠ Pass 4NT

The contract was the same at this table and the outcome should have been different — but it wasn't. Here when West led the ten of diamonds, East went up with the ace, presumably to shift to a heart at trick two. But lo and behold, East, after great thought, continued with a diamond and South made the contract instead of going down two.

The gambling three notrump must have some hidden virtue if the effect of its use is that it paralyzes the thinking processes of the defense to the extent that they are unable to cope with it.

## ECM Cold War Is Nearing End

PARIS (Reuters) — The cold war between France and its European Common Market partners is drawing to a close, French government sources said here.

As part of the process, a meeting of foreign ministers of the six market countries is expected to take place in the second half of December to discuss the entire organization of the trade group.

And a summit meeting of the heads of government of the six seems likely in the new year. President de Gaulle is reported to favor such a meeting, which West German Chancellor Erhard has sought for two years.

France has boycotted the market since June 30, when negotiations for financing a common agricultural policy among the six broke down.
