

Spectacular Air Show At Ch'town Airport Yesterday

Thousands of people flocked yesterday to the Charlottetown Airport where the greatest display of aeronautical skill ever to be seen in the Province was executed.

The Charlottetown Air Show, sponsored by 201 Wing R.C.A.F. Association, was under the distinguished patronage of His Honor Lieutenant Governor T. W. L. Prowse and Hon. A. W. Matheson, Premier of the Province.

It was featured by the acts of members of the National Air Shows of Columbus, Ohio. A fly-past of three F-86 Sabre jets from the R.C.A.F. base at Chatham, N. B., was an added attraction which to most of the crowd present, was a spectacle of such thrilling proportions as to be long remembered.

The master of ceremonies was that well known aviation and sports announcer Bill Sweet, who with his accurate and thrilling description of the various events kept the large gathering in a continual state of suspense.

Capt. Ben Huntley and Captain Roy Jocelyn put on a display of aerial acrobatics that was breathtaking to watch as they went through their antics. Bobby Ward was seen in two parachute jumps which displayed remarkable skill and courage to execute.

Perhaps the greatest thrill of the day came when the veteran Ben Huntley climbed into a 1910 pusher plane made by Curtiss.

NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS

SEALED TENDERS, properly identified, and addressed to the Director of the Maritime Marshland Rehabilitation Administration, Canada Department of Agriculture, Box 248, Amherst, Nova Scotia, will be received until 3:00 p.m. Amherst Time, August 20th, for the construction of a large abattoir, and appurtenant works, on the Shepody River, Albert County, New Brunswick.

The approximate extent of the project may be judged by the following estimates of work and materials required: 150,000 cu. yds. of rock excavation, 10,000 cu. yds. of concrete, 250,000 cu. yds. of rock fill and other works.

Plans, specifications and forms of tender may be obtained on and after July 27th at the address shown below. A deposit of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) by cash or by cheque made payable to the Receiver General of Canada, will be required for each set of plans, specifications and documents. This deposit may be recovered upon the completion of the plans, specifications and documents within the 30 days of the closing of tenders.

Each Tender must be accompanied by a certified cheque on a Canadian chartered bank, payable to the order of the Receiver General of Canada, in the sum of five per cent (5%) of the estimated cost of the work.

The certified cheque will be forfeited in the event that the successful tenderer refuses to enter into a contract on the basis of his tender, when called upon to do so, or fails to furnish the security deposit required.

The cheques of unsuccessful tenderers will be returned.

Any tender not accompanied by such certified cheque will not be considered.

The successful tenderer must, within eight days of notification of the acceptance of his tender, furnish a security deposit amounting to five per cent (5%) of the estimated value of the contract in the form of a certified cheque on a Canadian chartered bank, payable to the Receiver General of Canada, or by bonds of Canada or the Canadian National Railways guaranteed by Canada in bearer form or registered in the name of, or transferred by an instrument in writing to the Minister of Finance and Receiver General of Canada.

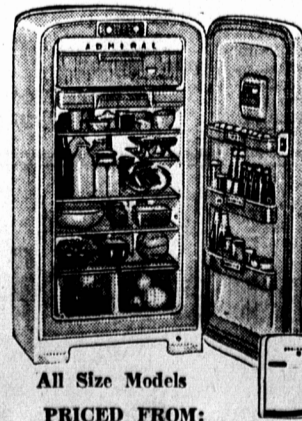
