Mr. and Mrs. Earle Dymond and family of Moncton, N.B., spent the weekend visiting relatives in Margate and Kensington.

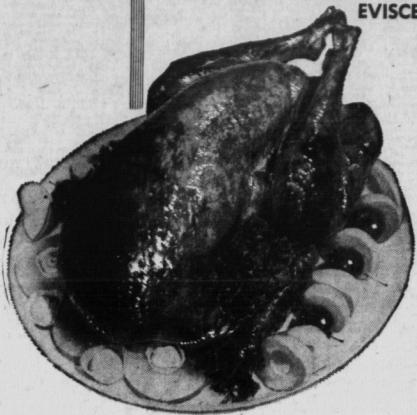
