ALBERTON — The death of Elgin Tanton occurred Monday morning at the home of his sister, Mrs. H.W. Matthews, Alberton. He had been in poor health for some time but death came unexpectedly.

Born at Sherbrooke 67 years ago, he was the eldest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Jarvis Tanton. In later years he and his family lived in St. Eleanor's then in Summerside. The greater part of his life was spent in Buffalo, N.Y. Last fall he came to live in Alberton.

Mr. Tanton, who was never married, is survived by the following brothers and sisters: Mrs. H.W. Matthews (Helen) in Alberton, Mrs. Carl Spornie (Isabella) in Connecticut, Bremer in Florida, Fulton in Edson, Alberta; Rev. Stavert Tanton in Halifax, Frank in Wingham and Mrs. Herbert Leavitt (Florence) in Alberton.

The funeral will be from the Compton Funeral Home to St. John's Anglican Church, St. Eleanor's, at 10:30 a.m. Friday.

In his announcement, Bishop Davis noted that King's, in its long history, has had a succession of able men as presidents who have guided the college in the training of many men and women outstanding in Canadian life and affairs. He paid tribute to Dr. Smith as a scholar and administrator and said that the board of governors was unanimous in their selection of a man to fill this high office.

Dr. Smith will assume his duties on Sept. 1. He succeeds Rev. Canon H. L. Puxley, president since 1954 who becomes director of the Canadian School of Missions and the first head of the newly-formed Canadian Institute of Ecumenical Affairs in Toronto.

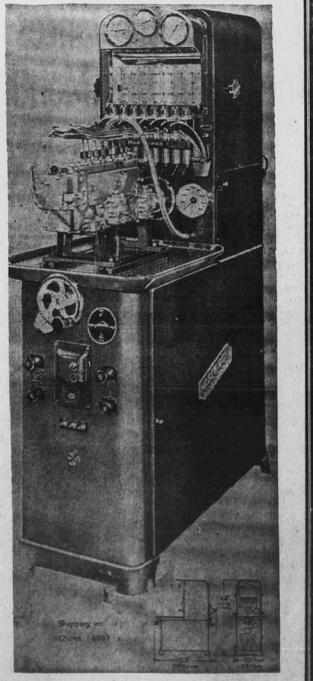
