The bidding:
 South West North East

Opening lead—jack of spades. Alert defense succeeded in defeating declarer in his three no-trump contract. South won the spade lead with the queen and could count seven sure winners. The best source for two additional tricks appeared to lie in clubs. So declarer played a diamond to the queen and led the jack of clubs. East made the fine play of going up with the ace and returned the jack of hearts. Declarer finessed the queen, losing to the king. Back came a low heart to the ten, which South ducked, and another heart which declarer was forced to take. When a club was then led, West promptly took the king, cashed his heart, and South was down one, having lost three hearts and two clubs. With all due credit to the defense, South should have made the hand. The fatal step was taken when declarer played his queen on East's jack of hearts return at trick four. South should have rejected the opportunity to finesse and played his ace instead. Had he done so, nothing could have prevented him from winning nine tricks. By taking the heart ace and leading another club his position would have become secure. With West on lead with the king of clubs, the queen of hearts could not be successfully attacked. And South, meanwhile, could count nine sure tricks. Now should this development come as a surprise to South. If the heart finesse at trick four is based on the hope that East has the king of hearts, then going up with the ace does not jeopardize the eventual stoppage if this is the case, even if he refuses the finesse. The point is that declarer, who has no way of knowing which defender has the king, cannot afford the finesse because the contract is in danger if the finesse loses. By playing the ace immediately he assures himself of nine tricks if West has the king of clubs or East the king of hearts.

Snowbound For 4 Days
 ARGENTIA, Nfld. (CP)—Francis Cardinal Spellman, Roman Catholic Archbishop of New York, finally got away from Newfoundland Sunday after being snowbound here for four days. He arrived at this United States naval base New Year's Eve from a tour of northern U.S. Air Force establishments. A snowstorm the following day grounded all air traffic and clogged airport runways with drifts. The cardinal's plane was not able to take off for New York until 12:29 a.m. NST Sunday.

In Scotland snow was six inches deep in places. In Paris the Seine rose nearly six inches during the night following a week of heavy rains, and floods threatened the capital and the river basin. Tow Freighter Towards Halifax
 HALIFAX (CP)—One distressed freighter off the east coast was being towed to Bermuda Sunday while a second ran into trouble in the thick ice of the Bay of Chaleur. The master of the 10,000-ton British freighter Hillcrest asked to be towed to Bermuda when the Halifax tug Foundation Vigilant reached her Sunday morning, 450 miles south of Nova Scotia. The freighter had been disabled with engine trouble since Thursday. Meanwhile, search and rescue headquarters here said the freighter Celeste apparently got free of an ice jam that earlier had locked her in the Bay of Chaleur off northern New Brunswick. The transport department vessel Edward Cornwallis had started to go to the freighter's aid.
