Missouri. The Herald correspondent estimates Lee's army at Richmond at 60,000 men, and that of Sherman at 100,000.

P. E. ISLAND TRADE AND FINANCE.

WE COPY THE FOLLOWING EXTRACT FROM A LATE NO. OF THE MONTEAL HERALD.

The Trade of P. E. Island in 1863 was exceedingly prosperous. The Controller's report just published lies before us, and from it we gather some facts that cannot fail to interest our readers, especially those among us who are anxiously awaiting the time when the "right time" will have arrived.

The Agricultural products of the Island brought some 25 per cent. higher than last year. These products represent a large item in the sum total of Exports. For instance, we learn from these returns that there were shipped from the Island 1,430,130 bushels of oats, 408,122 bushels of barley, 74,263 bushels of potatoes, 321 tons of wool, and 1,200 tons of fish.

The Controller also includes among "agricultural products" exported, 15,086 quintals of dry fish and 7,570 barrels of pickled fish. Charlestown, of course, is the great port of export, about one-third of the exports being from there; but Bellefleur, Georgetown, New London and Colville Bay are also very important ports in this respect.

It may not be out of place here to state that of the 439,122 bushels of oats exported last year, 38,000 bushels were shipped by one gentleman, J. S. Carvell, Esq., who is so well and favorably known in the Island.

The particular trade in fish has assumed large proportions, and is known to be a remunerative branch of industry. Last year 100 vessels were built, equal to 21,000 tons, old measure.

The Controller estimates their value at \$5,345,000, or \$24,945 sterling in the aggregate. This is the largest amount ever set apart in one year on the Island.
