Sevigny, 45, resigned from the cabinet Feb. 9, saying he could not agree with Prime Minister Diefenbaker's defence policy.

He said he will open his own business in a suburban Longueuil, the riding he has represented since 1958 and where he will be the official Progressive Conservative candidate.
