British Freighter Had Strike Ills

QUEBEC (CP) - The British freighter Seaway Discoverer sailed up the St. Lawrence Wednesday night after her cargo of 300,000 bushels of grain was unloaded over the protests of the Seafarers' International Union.
 The SIU threw a picket line around the vessel Tuesday and longshoremen refused to cross it to unload the ship.
 The ship's agents, Ramsey Greig and Company, said Wednesday an injunction was obtained preventing further picketing by the SIU. The injunction was obtained by Federal Commerce and Navigation Company of Montreal which has chartered the vessel.
 The SIU had mounted pickets in protest against wages paid aboard the Seaway Discoverer. The ship, chartered by Federal Commerce and Navigation Company of Montreal, has been running lakehead grain eastward and iron ore fro. Sept-Isles, Que., to Great Lakes ports since the start of the navigation season. She carries British officers and a Pakistani crew.
 Raymond Doucet, SIU spokesman, said Tuesday the picketing was to protest the seamen's "wages in the vicinity of £12 (about \$33) a month which we feel is unfair competition to Canadian rates."
