**Thalidomide Babies Facing Huge Problem**

That most who learned to scramble, they did not mix. It was the adults who put them on the blinking, placid monkey specially brought in for the party. It was the adults who sent them down the slide, or pushed them on the swings. When they laughed, they laughed with adult cooing - or alone.

They are the thalidomide babies. They are cared for at Chalder Heritage Hospital, south of London. There are only 19 thalidomide babies there now, and some will be going home to their parents as soon as domestic crises are resolved. Some children have been sent there while their mothers recover from a nervous breakdown brought on by the birth of the child. They are called BUV LIMBS.

Lady Hoare's appeal has been directed at providing artificial limbs for the children. Britain's socialized medicine system has failed them. The United States health ministry was literally swamped by the untold numbers of the unlimbed babies.

The Thalidomide Appeal project is finding suitable limbs. They are sent to Germany's Heisterberg University and returned with a special model powered by a cylinder of compressed gas.

After some delay, due in part to scepticism by some doctors, the health ministry ordered "quite a large number" and expected to be delivered to the children in the next few weeks.

Meanwhile, Lady Hoare's group has gone ahead on its own and filled nine children with the new type of limb at the Nuffield Orthopedic Foundation Hospital at Oxford. Doctors there also will perform surgery on deformed limbs so artificial ones can be fitted properly.

**Wood Furniture Industry Needs To Take Vast Steps**

Mr. Daigneault suggested that the Canadian wood furniture manufacturing industry look quickly at the experiences of Denmark and Sweden, "great furniture exporters who have developed all kinds of new techniques and designs."

Mr. Daigneault said in an interview the Canadian wood furniture industry is in most cases unimaginative, unorganized and unwilling to adopt the latest techniques.

He expressed his conclusions on more than 25 years consulting experience and on impressions gained in western Europe when on a recent Ottawa-sponsored technical mission.

There are about 25 important wood furniture manufacturing firms and 300 small ones in Quebec, said Mr. Daigneault. "Quite a fragmented" industry exists in the New York area and Ontario's the American middle west.

Canada's wood furniture exports to the U.S. amount to about \$100,000 a year while U.S. exports to Canada total about \$100,000,000.
