## Urges More Public Funds For CBC

OTTAWA, May 12 -- (CP)--A. D. Dunton, chairman of the CBC Board of Governors has announced the publicly-owned CBC must obtain more public funds if it is to maintain existing services, improve programs and extend coverage to all parts of the country.

He made the statement as the Commons Committee on Radio began its first review of CBC activities since 1947. The committee adjourned sine die.

Mr. Dunton said that unless the CBC obtains additional revenue it will have to cut services drastically. This would not mean small economies here and there. Programs would have to be dropped, some of the staff would have to be fired and the service to some parts of the country would have to be eliminated.

The CBC expects a deficit of \$900,000 on its recently concluded 1949-50 operations. The corporation, said Mr. Dunton, is operating on the same revenue basis as 11 years ago but in that period costs have risen by more than 100 per cent.

In addition, changes in methods of programming and in programs had added new charges.
